



Accessibility Tool How To's for Windows 10

<u>To Enlarge Text</u> go to **Settings** choose **Ease of Access** then **Magnifier** increase the magnification zoom level (to make it all larger) and/or turn on the Magnifier (to enlarge a particular area).




<u>Enlarging apps and text on the Display:</u> go to **Settings** choose **System** and **Display** click Change the size of Text, apps and other items. You can also use the slider at the bottom right.




Making the Cursor Easier to See:

Go to Settings choose Ease of Access then Other Options, select Cursor Thickness and slide to select




<u>Enlarging the Mouse Pointer</u>: Go to **Settings** choose **Ease of Access** then **Mouse** and change **pointer size** and **pointer color**



<u>Turn on High Contrast to make seeing the screen easier:</u> Go to **Settings** choose **Ease of Access** then **Ease of Access Center** choose **Set up High**

Add Speak to the Quick Access Toolbar- for Reading Word Docs aloud

You can add the Speak command to your Quick Access Toolbar by doing the following:

1. Next to the Quick Access Toolbar, click Customize Quick Access Toolbar.



- 2. Click More Commands.
- 3. In the Choose commands from list, select All Commands.
- 4. Scroll down to the **Speak** command, select it, and then click **Add**.
- 5. Click OK.
- 6. When you want to use the text-to-speech command, click the icon on the Quick Access Toolbar.

Convert text to speech

After you have added the **Speak** command to your Quick Access Tool, you can hear single words or blocks of text spoken by highlighting the text you want to hear, and then clicking the **Speak** command.
