

Middle School Plan 2020

Parents must choose a learning model for their student by Tuesday, August 11, 2020.

Parents will be choosing a learning model for all of first semester.

Learning Model #1:

ON-SITE LEARNING

The district will transition between three environments within the On-Site model based on the gating criteria approved by the school board on August 3rd.

ON-SITE LEARNING

- Face to face instruction utilizing an 8 period schedule.
- Students and staff are in the school building.

HYBRID LEARNING

- A combination of On-Site and Remote Learning Environments.
- Students will be divided into two groups based on last names/families.
- Students will be 50% in person and 50% remote.

REMOTE LEARNING

- Remote learning will be implemented if we, as a district, are needing or are mandated to close a school or the entire district due to an outbreak of COVID-19, shortage of teachers, etc.
- ALL student will receive instruction remotely.

Learning Model #2: OPTIONAL REMOTE LEARNING

OPTIONAL REMOTE LEARNING

- This option is for those learners who have chosen to learn entirely online/remotely from home.
- All Optional Remote course offerings are dependent on enrollment and staffing.
 - *This is the same guideline we follow with any course offering in the district.*

BUILDING HEALTH AND SAFETY PROTOCOLS

ILLNESS

Per district policy, we ask families to keep students home if they are ill.

MASKS

Masks will be required of all students and staff at all times while in the building, per current mandate. *Students will be permitted to remove their mask to eat lunch.*

TEMPERATURE CHECKS

Staff and student temperature checks will be conducted every morning starting at 7:35, in compliance with executive order 20-59.

TRAINING

Professional development will be provided to all staff at the start of the school year on cleaning and sanitizing learning spaces.

DELIVERIES

Items needing to be dropped off to students will be placed on a table in the entry way of the building.

NURSE'S OFFICE

There will be an area for students displaying symptoms of COVID which will be separate from the nurse's office.

SEATING CHARTS

Seating charts will be required on buses, in classrooms, and during lunch to help facilitate contact tracing if necessary.

HAND WASHING

Hand washing will be required throughout the day. Additional hand sanitizer will be available in each classroom.

CHANGES TO THE CLASSROOM/SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT

BACK TO SCHOOL EVENTS

- Family events will be primarily virtual.
- Student events held in person requiring masks and/or social distancing with limited family participation in a highly structured environment.

CLASSROOMS

- Classrooms will adhere to reasonable social distancing guidelines.
- Students will be required to report to classrooms upon entering school
- We will minimize the sharing of suppl

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ADJUSTMENTS

- Adjustments will be made to serving lines.
- Seating charts will be used.

PASSING PERIODS

- Students will not be using lockers, unless necessary for special circumstances.
- Students must leave the school at dismissal, unless required to stay for school needs/ activities.

MAIN OFFICE

- All visitors to the building must have an appointment scheduled through the Main Office.
- All visitors must currently wear a mask.

OTHER INFORMATION

- Field trips and all school assemblies will be on hold until further notice.
- Volunteers (inside the building) will not be permitted until further notice.

SCHOOL STATUS UPDATES

- The following communication channels will be used to communicate schedule transition (On-Site to Hybrid, for example) as soon as information becomes available: Skyward emails and district text messaging service

ENHANCED CLEANING PROTOCOL

- Increased number of hand sanitizer stations in key locations.
- Safe, effective cleaning products used on schedule throughout the day in all high-touch areas in school and on buses.
- Intense cleaning nightly.

ILLNESS PROTOCOL

- COVID-19 and other illness protocols are based on Johnson County Health Department exclusion requirements and recommendations.
