Each school day, the district welcomes more than 7,200 students through the doors of its 12 campuses with seven elementary schools, three middle schools, and two high schools. USD 232 encompasses an area of 100+ square miles in northwest Johnson County, Kansas and draws from the communities of De Soto, Shawnee, Lenexa, Olathe, and unincorporated areas of the county. Mill Valley High School has a record of steady, marked improvement with a continual quest for excellence. It has built a legacy of achievement in instructional program quality and extracurricular/co-curricular activities. Grade point average is figured on the traditional four-point system. A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0. AP and Dual enrollment classes are weighted as follows: A=5, B=4, C=3. Honors and Pre AP courses are weighted as follows: A=4.5, B=3.5, C=2.5. All grades are included in the computation of the grade point average with the exception of Pass/Fail classes.
