



Important information to know PRIOR to applying to JCCC CTE:

- See your counselor to start the application process.
- Juniors or Seniors may apply.
- Composition I grade of C or better.
- Transportation is the responsibility of the student to and from the [JCCC Main Campus](#) (12345 College Blvd, Overland Park, KS 66210), and the [JCCC Olathe Campus](#) for the CNA Program (21201 W. 152nd Street Olathe, KS 66061)
- This is a Dual Credit Program, meaning that you will receive credit towards high school graduation and college credit at the same time.
- Tuition and fees are paid for by the State of Kansas due to [Excel in CTE](#) (SB155).
- Some programs have costs for uniforms, tools, or consumable materials, which are paid for by the student and become the property of the student. Course materials must be purchased prior to the start of class and are subject to change without notice.
- To complete most programs, high school student graduates return to JCCC as a full-time postsecondary student (after high school) to finalize training. Completers are awarded a JCCC certificate and are deemed employable. Note: CNA students can earn enough JCCC credits to complete their training during one year of attendance.

JCCC CTE Application Timeline & Steps

1. Apply to the USD 232 “Excel in CTE” Program.
2. See your counselor prior to completing the next step.
3. Apply to [JCCC](#) by **April 1**.
4. Complete Accuplacer Exam: “[Take the Test](#)”.

NOTE:

JCCC acceptance is based on an ACT Reading score of 19 or higher, OR an Accuplacer Reading score of 243.

JCCC will refer to you as a “College Now” student who is taking classes on the JCCC Campus.

USD 232 Program Description – 2 credits

Healthcare Science I & II provides classroom and clinical instruction for basic care of clients in long-term and acute-care facilities. Students will learn skills for daily hygiene, bedside care, vital-sign measurement, positioning and safe transfer of clients. You will learn about common health problems and chronic illnesses. Clinical practice sessions are conducted in the nursing home setting. This course is offered in a classroom setting as well as non-traditional online. Upon successful completion of the course, students will be scheduled to take the Kansas CNA examination.

USD 232 Program Description – 3 credits

Auto Technology I is a comprehensive course/program which consists of Intro to Auto Shop Practices, Brakes I, Brakes II, and Electrical I concurrently. This comprehensive course is NATEF approved and provides students with the basic theories and information needed to develop an understanding of basic shop practices, how to inspect and service drive train components, suspension, steering, and brakes.

Auto Technology II is a comprehensive course which consists of Steering and Suspension I, Alignment Practicum, Engine Performance I, Automotive Engine Repair, and Electrical II concurrently. This comprehensive course is NATEF approved allowing students to explore and develop an understanding in automotive electrical and engine controls.

Auto Tech Costs:

Supplies: required safety glasses and other protective equipment such as mechanics gloves – less than \$100

Textbooks: Approx. \$150 per semester

Lab Books: JCCC publish, less than \$50
