


De Soto USD 232 KANSAS TEACHER OF THE YEAR PROGRAM

Parents,

This first semester in Pathways class we have spent a lot of time discussing and discovering our personal strengths and interests, as well as our learning styles and goals we have for the future. We will be utilizing a program called Xello to research and gain insight into the careers students are both interested in, and careers they may not have considered before.
